6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) followed at present in the college, enabling students to make their choices.

Skill Based Elective Courses are available to the students irrespective of their major subjects. This facility enables students to choose the courses of their interest.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

The following teaching and learning methods had been followed.
